Job Corps is a voluntary career training and education program that prepares young people ages 16 through 24 for careers in today's job market. We train, educate, assist with job placement, and provide post-graduate support for students. Our curriculum is designed to **meet industry standards**, and our graduates have the **hands-on experience, education, and employability skills** that you want.

Job Corps serves **60,000 young people** each year. Most students leave home to receive career training at one of our 125 locations across the country. After graduation, students have the opportunity to relocate or pursue local employment.
